Located on the tip of South Malé Atoll and only 45 minutes by speedboat from the airport, Olhuveli offers 166 rooms, stunning beaches, abundant sandbanks and superb recreational activities. Facilities include a selection of restaurants and bars, two large pools with infinity edge, floodlit tennis court, volleyball and a spa. There is an excellent watersports centre - with one of the only registered kite-surfing schools in the Maldives - as well as wake-boarding, stand-up paddle-boarding and a diving school with PADI Gold Palm status. A large, shallow blue lagoon surrounds the whole island, which also makes it great for snorkelling.
